- To recognise where some Christmas traditions began.

Christmas	December 25 th – a celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ.
Celebration	A time that is made special with gifts, parties or activities.
Christian	Someone who believes in Jesus Christ and follows his teachings.
Jesus	The person who started the Christian faith. Christians believe he is the son of God.
Present / gift	Something that someone gives to someone else to show how they love, like or appreciate them.
Santa	A chubby, friendly person who brings gifts to children at Christmas time. Santa has different names in different parts of the world, including St Nicholas.
Surprise	For Christmas, to make someone feel wonder or amazement with a gift.
